Vineyard Locations	A Yountville site and a vineyard in the foothills just south of Stags Leap District
2011 Growing Season	The vintage started with a cool spring and the summer that followed was sunny and mild holding fruit development to a slow, even pace. With extra work in the vineyard, pruning away any less than ideal fruit, we enjoyed a harvest of beautiful fruit loaded with elegant, enticing flavor.
Varietal Composition	75% Merlot, 15% Cabernet Sauvignon, 8% Malbec, 2% Petite Verdot
Brix at Harvest	23.5° – 25.5°
Cooperage	20 months in 60-gallon French oak barrels (75% new: Vosage, Allier and Tronçais)
Alcohol	15.1%
Food Affinities	Flatter Merlot's fruit by adding a similar element of fruit to poultry, pork and meat dishes (duck breast with dried cherry-Merlot sauce, roast chicken with cranberry-wild rice stuffing). Carmelized onions, roasted garlic and mushrooms are pleasant companions.
